Be it remembered, that on the third day of March, Eighteen hundred and nineteen, personally came before me the undersigned judge of the District Court of the United States, in and for the said District Daniel Kenny, of the County of Knox, in the said District, who being duly sworn Declareth and saith, that in, he believes, the month of June, seventeen hundred and seventy six, at Sunbury in the State of Pennsylvania, he enlisted, for three years, in the service of the United States, in Captain John Doyles Independant Company attached to the first Pennsylvania Regiment, on the Continental Establishment, commanded by Colo. Edward Hand, and afterwards by Colo. James Chambers. That he continued to serve in the said Corps, for the said Term and immediately after his Discharge from service, he again enlisted at the Valley Forge, in Pennsylvania, for two years, in Captain John Doyles Company of the sixth Pennsylvania Regiment, on the Continental Establishment, commanded by Colo. Robert Magaw [BLWt1412-500]. That he continued in service in the said corps or in the service of the United States, for the said term of two years, and was finally discharged the service, near Richmond Virginia, on the seventeenth day of August in the year seventeen hundred and eighty one. That he has lost his discharges, and has no other evidence in his power of his said service. That during the time of his service, he was in the battles at Trenton [26 Dec 1776], Princeton [3 Jan 1777], Germantown [4 Oct 1777], Monmouth [28 Jun 1778] and Greensprings [Green Springs Plantation in VA, 6 Jul 1781]. That he is now in the seventy first year of his age, palsied, in reduced circumstances, not having more two hundred dollars worth of property, and needs the assistance of his country for support. And therefore prays the benefit of an act of Congress Intitled, "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war"
