Pension Application of Richard Baughan S37724

Virginia

At a superior court of law held for the county of Charlotte at the Courthouse on Monday the 12<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year 1819

Richard Baughan came into Court, and made oath, that he enlisted under Capt Gregory Smith in the County of King & Kueen [sic: King and Queen] attached to the 7<sup>th</sup> Virginia Reg't. commanded by Col McClannahan [sic: Alexander McClenachan] on Continental Establishment in the year 1776 for the term of two years to fight against the Common Enemy. That after the expiration of the said term of 2 years he enlisted under Capt Thomas Hill (who was a lieutenant in the Company of Capt Smith) for the term of three years and was attached to the same Regiment then commanded by Col Heath [sic: William Heth]. That he was in the Battles of Brandy Wine [sic: Brandywine, 11 Sep 1777], Germantown [4 Oct 1777] and Monmouth [28 Jun 1778] & Stoney point [sic: Stony Point NY, 16 Jul 1779] and then marched to the south and was taken prisoner at Charlestown [Charleston SC, 12 May 1780], made his escape and joined the army again at Chesterfield Courthouse Virg'a and was discharged at Petersburg Va by Gen'l. Mullenburg [sic: Peter Muhlenberg] and that he served the time for which he enlisted as above and gave up his discharge on receiving his land Warrant, that he has no property in very reduced circumstances —
