[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

On this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of July 1818 before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the General Court of the State aforesaid personally appeared Clement Hasty aged 62 years, resident in Culpeper [County] in the said State who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war:" That he the said Clement Hasty enlisted in Fauquier County in the State of Virginia in August 1776 in the company commanded by Captain William Blackwell of the 11<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment; that he continued to serve in said Corps, or in the service of the United States until the month of August 1779, when he was discharged from service in Ramapo State of New York or Jersey, which State is not recollected, that he was in the battles of Brandywine [September 11, 1777], Germantown [October 4, 1777] & Stony Point [July 16, 1779] and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services except the Certificate of the Chief Justice of the US now enclosed.

I do hereby certify that Clement Hasty enlisted as a soldier in the company commanded by the late Captain William Blackwell in the 11<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment sometime in the summer or autumn of 1776 for three years, & that he served out his time. After the resignation of Captain Blackwell, the company was commanded by myself.

State of Virginia Culpeper County to wit

On the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of August 1820 personally Appeared in open Court, being a court of record established by an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia for the said County of Culpeper, Clement Hastie aged about sixty-three years resident in the said County who being sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows that is to say he was enlisted in Captain Blackwell's Company of the 11<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment on Continental line commanded by Colonel Woodford [William Woodford] and remained in service for the space of three years – and in the course of that service was in the Battles of Brandywine, Germantown and Stony Point under General Wayne [Anthony Wayne] – and in some skirmishes.

That he has heretofore made declaration in conformity with the law of the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that his name is inscribed as a private in the Army of the Revolution on the pension list Roll of Virginia Agency at the rate of \$8 per month to commence on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of July as will more fully appear by his pension Certificate bearing date the 30<sup>th</sup> day of January 1819 & by J C Calhoun Esquire Secretary of War with the seal of the State thereto affixed, the number of which said Certificate appears to be 6229 payable semiannually on the 4<sup>th</sup> of March at the Branch Bank of the United States Richmond Virginia – And the said Clement Hastie further solemnly swears that he was a resident Citizen to a good done of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that he has not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner whatever disposed of his property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring himself within the provision of an act of Congress entitled “an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war” passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818, and that he has not nor has any person in trust for me any property, or securities, contracts or debts due to him nor has he any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and subscribed by him

And I do further declare that I was a common laborer but am now entirely helpless in many respects not being able to work or act my own victuals & that my family consist of a wife nearly about the same age with myself a Daughter upwards of 30 years old and 3 Grand Children under age – that he has a little piece of mountain man consisting of about 70 acres but for little else than firewood
