[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

State and District of Virginia Frederick County Sct.

On this 4<sup>th</sup> day of June 1818 before me the subscriber, sole and presiding Judge of the Superior Court of law for the said County in the State and district aforesaid personally appeared William Kingore aged sixty-two years, resident in the said County & State and district, who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war:" That he, the said William Kingore enlisted in the said County in the state aforesaid on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year 1777 in the company commanded by Captain John McGuire of the 16<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment on Continental establishment, and then commanded by Colonel William Grayson, to serve for three years; that he continued in service in the said Corps, or in the service of the United States until the expiration of his said term, when he was discharged from service in Frederick town in Maryland. That he afterwards [applied] for his discharge to General Dan Morgan [Daniel Morgan] to enable him to draw his Depreciation, that he was in the battles of Brandywine [September 11, 1777], Germantown [October 4, 1777] and Monmouth [June 28, 1778] and that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.

At a Court continued and held for Frederick County the 1<sup>st</sup> day of August 1820

On this 1<sup>st</sup> day of August 1820 personally appeared in open Court being a Court of Record for said County of Frederick William Kingore aged sixty-five years at October resident in the said County of Frederick who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary war in the Company commanded by John McGuire in the Regiment commanded by Colonel William Grayson in the Virginia Line and that he hath received a certificate for a pension No. 7926. And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner whatever disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provision of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war" passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818, and that I have not nor has any

person in trust for me any property, or securities, contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed excepting necessary clothing and bedding.

One lame mare and colt, one cow, two shoats, two pots, three Dutch ovens, one chest, one table, eight split bottom chairs, some plates and knives and forks, and some Shoemaker's tools

I am by trade a Shoemaker, I am at times afflicted with Rheumatic pains, I have no wife – I have four daughters living with me the youngest of which is thirteen years of age, they spin when they can get it to do, but are able to earn a little more or hardly so much as well support themselves
