[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of Virginia, to wit:

At a monthly Court held for the County of Orange at the Courthouse on Monday the 27th of April 1818

Thomas Marsh, aged seventy-two years and a resident of this County, appeared in Court this 27th day of April 1818, and being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the pension made by the late Act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war" – That the said Thomas Marsh enlisted in the fifth Regiment of the Virginia line on Continental establishment, in the company commanded by Thomas Gaskins of said State, that he continued to serve in the said Corps in the service of the United States for three years, and served afterwards in the Cavalry until the close of the War, when he was discharged from service in the State of North Carolina; that he was in the battles of Trenton [December 26, 1776], Brandywine [September 11, 1777 and Germantown [October 4, 1777]; that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his Country for support and that he has no other evidence of his Services –

Whereupon it is ordered to be certified, that it appears to the satisfaction of the Court, that the said Thomas Marsh did serve in the Revolutionary War as stated in the preceding declaration against the common enemy – And that a copy of said declaration be transmitted to the Secretary of the Department of War, pursuant to the directions of the 4 mentioned Act of Congress [attested by Reynolds Chapman, clerk of court May 15th, 1818]

[Veteran was pensioned at the rate of \$8 per month commencing April 27, 1818, for service as a private for 3 years in the Virginia Continental line.]
