Pension Application of Neal Peacock S40247

State of Ohio }
Harrison County } On the first day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, before me Matthew Simpson one of the Associate Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of Harrison

County aforesaid, personally appeared Neal Peacock, a resident and citizen of said county, who being duly sworn, makes the following declaration, in order to procure relief under the provisions of the act of congress passed March 18 1818 Entitled, "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war" That he enlisted at the town of Frederick town in the State of Maryland, on the twenty fourth day of December A.D. 1776, under Lieutenant [later Captain] Jonathan Morris, in Capt. Elisha Williams' Company, attached to the Seventh Regiment, Commanded by Col. John Gunby of the Maryland line. that he was in the battles of Staten Island [21 Aug 1777] - Brandywine [11 Sep 1777], at the Seige of Mud Island Fort [Fort Mifflin PA, 10 - 15 Nov 1777], where he was wounded - he was also in the battles of Monmouth [28 Jun 1778] - Gum Swamp [Battle of Camden SC, 16 Aug 1780] - Cowpens [17 Jan 1781] - Guildford [sic: Guilford Courthouse NC, 15 Mar 1781], and Eteau Springs in South Carolina [sic: Eutaw Springs, 8 Sep 1781], under Gen'l. Green [sic: Nathanael Greene], in the company commanded by Capt. Richard Anderson. that he was discharged, or rather furloughed at Annapolis, on the 31st day of July A.D. 1783, by Capt. Gray. that the furlough which he received amounted to a discharge. that he has lost said furlough. that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of his country's assistance. that he herewith transmits all the evidence in his power of the foregoing facts.

Harrison County } SS Court of Common Pleas July Term one thousand eight hundred and Twenty. On this 31st day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Twenty personally appeared in open Court being a Court of Common Pleas begun and held at Cadiz in and for said Harrison County in the State of Ohio on the thirty first day of July one thousand eight hundred and Twenty being also a Court of Record by the Constitution and Laws of said State. Neal Peacock aged Sixty Seven years Eleven months and one day, Resident in said Harrison County who being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows, that is to say he the said Neal enlisted with Lieutenant Jonathan Morris in Captain Elisha William's Company in the seventh Maryland Regiment of the Maryland line Commanded by Col. Grunby [sic] on the Twenty fourth day December one thousand seven hundred and seventy six and served from that time until November in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty three when he was discharged by the proclamation of General George Washington. And that his original Declaration is dated on the first day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and that the number of his Pension Certificate is eleven thousand Six hundred and Twenty four and I do Solemnly Swear that I was a Resident Citizen of the United States on the eighteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighteen & that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the eighteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighteen and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or Securities, Contracts or Debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me Subscribed to wit
