[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

On this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of September A.D.1818 before me the Subscriber one of the Judges of the Superior Courts of Law and Equity for the State personally appeared Fabin Gilgo aged Sixty-three years resident in Onslow County in the State aforesaid who being by me first duly Sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled An act to provide for Certain persons engaged in the land and naval Service of the United States in the revolutionary war that he the said Fabin Gilgo enlisted in Craven County in the State aforesaid in the Company Commanded by Captain Anthony Sharp [Anthony Sharpe] of the Second Regiment of North Carolina on or about the 25<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year 1777 or thereabouts that he continued to serve in the said Corps on the Continental establishment war in the Service of the United States until on or about the 25<sup>th</sup> of April ensuing when he was discharged from service in South Carolina at a place called Bacon's Bridge that he was in no particular engagement, that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said Services.

I William Hill Secretary of State in & for the State aforesaid do hereby certify that it appears from the muster rolls of the North Carolina Continental Line in the Revolutionary War that Fabin Gilgo a private in Captain Sharp's Company of the 10<sup>th</sup> Regiment was enlisted in 1781 for 12 months, and served out his time, which ended on the 15<sup>th</sup> of April 1782.

State of North Carolina, Onslow County

On this 6<sup>th</sup> day of November A.D. 1821 Personally appeared in Open Court, being a Court of record for said County Fabin Gilgo aged 66 years, resident in said County who being first duly Sworn according to law doth, on his oath declare that he served in the revolutionary war as follows, Second Regiment of North Carolina in the Company commanded by Anthony Sharp Captain. The date of his original Declaration was the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of September 1818 and Number of his pension certificate is 10,067

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of

March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale or other wise disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provision of an act of Congress entitled “an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war” passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818, and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property, or securities, contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.
