The State of Ohio Licking County.

Personally appeared before me the Subscriber, president Judge of the fourth Circuit of the Courts of Common pleas of Said State, Simon Hill aged about fifty seven years, a resident of the County of Licking & State aforesaid who being duly cautioned and sworn according to Law, doth upon his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provisions of the late law of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land & Naval Service of the United States in the revolutionary War" (Viz) That he served in the army of his Country for the period of about one year, --- That he enlisted at Fauquier Court House in the State of Virginia in a company Commanded by Captain \_\_\_\_\_ [blank in the original] Armstrong in the Second regiment Commanded by Colonel Samuel Hawes (as he believes) of the Virginia line, in the Month of September in the year before Cornwallis was taken [October 19, 1781]. That he continued to serve in the Said corps in the Service of the United States until about the Month of September following, and was discharged (Honably) from the Service at the high hills of Santee [River] in South Carolina --- That his discharge was signed by Major \_ original] Sneed but which is now lost or destroyed. That he was engaged in the following battles (viz) The battle of Guilford Court House [March 15, 1781] --- Camden [Probably the 2<sup>nd</sup> battle of Camden otherwise known as the Battle of Hobkirk Hill, April 25, 1781 --- The Siege of Fort 96 [Siege of Ninety Six, May 21-June 19, 1781 -- and at the battle of the Eutaw Springs [September 8, 1781] ---That he is now in reduced circumstances in life and needs the assistance of his Country for Support --- and that he hath now no other evidence in his power of his Said Service and further he Saith not ---.

I William Wilson Judge as aforesaid do hereby Certify that is has been made appear to my satisfaction that the Said Simon Hill did Serve in the revolutionary war as stated in the foregoing Deposition against the common enemy, on the Continental establishment --- And also that he is now in reduced circumstances in life and needs the assistance of his Country for Support --- And I now transmit the proceedings taken and had before me to the secretary for the department of War agreeably to the aforesaid act of Congress.

## The State of Ohio Licking County SS

On this 27<sup>th</sup> day of October 1820, personally appeared in open Court of common pleas holden in Newark, for the County of Licking being a court of record proceeding according to the course of common Law, with a jurisdiction unlimited in point of amount and keeping a record of its proceedings, Simon Hill aged 57 years resident in Licking County aforesaid who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the Acts of Congress of the 18<sup>th</sup> of March 1818 and first of May 1820, that he served in the Revolutionary War in the company commanded by Captain \_\_ Armstrong in the Regiment commanded by Colonel \_\_ Gaskins in the line of Virginia and has obtained a pension under the act of the 18<sup>th</sup> of March 1818, his certificate being numbered 15.129. And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner whatever disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provision of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war" passed on the 18th day of March 1818, and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property, or securities, contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.
