
[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

To the honorable the Secretary of War of the United States.

The Petition of Simeon Moore a Citizen of the United States and a resident of the County of Craven and State of North Carolina respectfully Showeth that your Petitioner enlisted as a Soldier in the regular Army of the United States under Captain Benjamin Coleman as well as he recollects some time in the year 1779. Your Petitioner continued to do duty as a private soldier in said Company in the 10<sup>th</sup> North Carolina Regiment commanded by Col. Archibald Lytle for nearly 18 months when the said Regiment which was part of the Southern Army was disbanded near Charleston South Carolina about the close of the war. Your Petitioner, as he believes was the case with his Brother Soldiers, received no discharge but a furlough until called on, which furlough he has lost. Your Petitioner is about 78 years of age, he is poor, and needs the assistance of his Country for Support.

Levi Kent<sup>1</sup> maketh oath that to his knowledge Simeon Moore was a private soldier in Colonel Archibald Lytle's Regiment during the revolutionary War and did duty as such about 17 months – The said Moore and this Deponent entered the Army at the same time, served together in the same Regiment, were with the same Regiment when it was disbanded near Charleston at the close of the War, and returned together to Craven County North Carolina in which neighborhood they have both ever since lived.
