

Andrew Douglass Personally appeared before the Subscriber one of the Judges of the court of common pleas in & for said county who being duly sworn deposeth and saith, That he enlisted as a private in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy six for the Term of three years in Capt Thomas Farrels company in the 13th Virginia Regiment, and faithfully served the Term for which he so enlisted as appears by the discharge hereto annexed, dated the 14th June one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine signed by Capt [sic] Richard Campbell, and countersignd by Col. Daniel Broadhead [sic: Daniel Brodhead]. and further that from his reduced circumstances he needs the assistance of his country for support. And he doth further state that he never was allowed any pension from the united states.



