City of Philadelphia Ss.

Be it remembered that on the 7 day of October AD 1819 Personally appeared before me George Bartram one of the Alderman for said City, Thomas Moore who being duly sworn, depose and say, that he served in the American Revolutionary war, in the first Regiment of the Pennsylvania line commanded by Colonel Robinson in Capt. Stakes [Jacob Stake] company, and was wounded near the Green Springs in the State of Virginia [Green Springs Plantation, 6 Jul 1781], and in the year 1784 [page torn here and elsewhere marked *] was incribed on the Pension Roll of Pennsylvania [*] five dollars pr month, untill about two years ago [*]n he was incribed at eight dollars pr Month, [*] always received his pension untill the present [*]pplication when it was refused, in consequence of his not haveing his Pension ticket
