


Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements & Rosters

Pension Application of John Derrough S44137 VA

State of Ohio } On this 12 Day of June Ano Domino 1818
Monroe County } Before Me [Levin Okey] the subscribor one of the judges of the Cort of
Common Pleas in and for the County and State Aforesaid Personally Appeared
john Derrough Aged seventy Nines yeairs Resident in the County and state Aforesaid Who being By Me
Duly sworn According to Law Doth on His oath Make the followin Decleration in order to obtain the
Provision Made By the Late act of Congress intitling an act to Provide for scertin Persons ingaged in the
Land and Navil survice of the United states in the Revolutionery War that He the said John Durrrough
inlisted in the munth of March 1779 during the war in the state of Varginea in the company commanded
by Capt. Lawson [probably Claiborne W. Lawson] in the Verginea Line General Mullingsburgs bergade
[sic: Peter Muhlenberg's brigade] in the first Varginnea Ridgment Was taken prisoner the 12 day of May
1780 at the seege of Charlstown [siege of Charleston] from which place he made his escape on the first
day of Agust 1780 and farther that he is in reduced sarcomstance and stands in need of assistance of his
country for support and that has no other evidance now in his power of his said survices



State of Ohio } At a Court of Common Pleas At the July Term 1820 – on this 22^d day of July
Monroe County } A.D. 1820 personally appeared in open Court being a Court of Record for said
County, John Darrough aged 80 years resident in Monroe County Ohio who being first duly sworn
according to Law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows;
as a private in Capt Leonard Lawsons [sic] Company first Reiment of the Virginia line commanded by
Col [Richard] Parker for the term of at least three years; He has secured a pension Certificate from
Govenment the number of which is 11.897 and that date of his original declaration was the 12th day of
June 1818

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818
and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part
thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress
entitled “an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States
in the Revolutionary War” passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person
in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than
what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed; John Darrough
