Lycoming County Ss.

On this sixth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Court of Common pleas in and for said County, personally appears Frederick Hill aged Fifty nine years resident in Lycoming County afsd, who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the revolutionary war" that he the said Frederick Hill enlisted in Berks County State of Pennsylvania in the year 1777 in the company commanded by Captain Robert Conelly [Robert Connelly] in the Regiment commanded by Colonel William Butler for Three years, that he served the three years that he enlisted for in the Pennsylvania line in the same corps, when he was discharged from service, on James River in the State of Virginia, that he was in the Battles of Monmouth [28 Jun 1778] and at James Town in Virginia [Battle of Green Springs Plantation near Jamestown, 6 Jul 1781] and that he is in reduced circumstances in life and stands in need of the assistance of his Country for support, and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services. District of Pennsylvania Ss

On this fifth day of September 1820 Personally appeared in open Court of Common Pleas held in Williamsport for the County of Lycoming being a Court of record proceeding according to the course of common Law with jurisdiction unlimited in point of amount and keeping record of proceedings Frederick Hill aged sixty one years resident in Lycoming County in said district who being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the act of Congress of the eighteenth of March 1818 and the first of May 1820 that he served in the Revolutionary War in the company commanded by Capt Robert Connelly in the Regiment commanded by Col William Butler in the line of the State of Pennsylvania and has obtained a pension under the act of the 18th March 1818 his certificate being numbered 3779 And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed. signed in german Frederick Hill
