Pension Application of Thomas Smith S6125

State of Virginia

County of Madison (Sct.)

On this 23 day of August 1832 personally appeared in open court, before the Justices of the Court of the County of Madison now sitting a resident of the County & State aforesaid Thomas Smith aged Sixty six years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath, make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed 7 June 1832. That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officer and served as herein stated.

He enlisted under Capt. Jno Roberts [John Roberts] in Culpeper County Virg'a. the Reg't. commanded by Colo. Frank Taylor [Francis Taylor]; he served better than three years, he was transferred to a company commanded by Capt. Thomas Porter, he enlisted in the year 1777 or 1778. he was stationed at the Albemarle Barracks [constructed in Jan 1779 for prisoners captured at Burgoyne's surrender at Saratoga on 17 Oct 1777] afterwards he was marched to Peaked Mountain he was then marched to Winchester Barracks where he was afterwards discharged; afterwards he served two Militia Tours of Three months the other about forty days, he served under Capt. Young in the Militia. The evidence of Jno Jones [John Jones, pension application S5629] is hereafter forward

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, & declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state.

NOTE: On 26 June 1838 Smith applied for a new pension certificate to replace one he had lost.
