- 4 How were you called into service, were you drafted, did you volunteer or were you a substitute, and if a substitute for whom/
- A. I was drafted.
- 5 State the names of some of the Regular Officers who were with the troops where you served; such Continental and Militia Regiments as you can recollect, and the General Circumstances of your service.
- A. Capt Robert Harris, Colo Nicholas Lewis, Capt Wm Dalton, Colo. Stubblefield, Gen'l Steuben, Capt Henry Burk & Colo Reuben Lindsay the general circumstances of my service I have stated in my declaration.
- 6 Did you ever receive a discharge from service and if so by whom was it given and what has become of it
- A I received a discharge in every instance, but by whom they were given I dont now recollect, having lost them.

[Jonathan Munday stated that he served three tours with Dunn, and Samuel Barksdale stated that he served the last tour with Dunn.]

NOTE: The pension file of Brightberry Brown (R1282) contains a newspaper obituary of Brown, who died on 26 Jan 1846, as well as James Dunn, both of whom were said to have resided in the northern part of Albemarle County.
