[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]


[p 2: Printed form of Indent No. 6 Book M dated October 1, 1784 “delivered to Lieutenant George Hammond late of Lieutenant Colonel Samuel Hammond’s Regiment State Troops this our Indented Certificate for the Sum of One hundred forty-one pounds Sterling being Balance of Pay and Bounty due him for Services in that Regiment together with Interest thereon from the 1st April 1782 to the date of this indent agreeable to a resolution of the General assembly the [text too faint to discern] &c”]

For a valuable consideration received from John Leacraft of Beaufort District – I hereby Assign all my right & Title and Interest of in & to the within Indent and the monies due or to grow due thereon to the said John Leacraft his Executors, administrators horse and Assigns forever witness my hand and Seal this 7th day of December 1784.
