[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

[Note: Although I have transcribed this information in a separate file, I think it more than likely that this claimant is the same man as [Daniel Carrell R1726](#). I base this opinion on the fact that Daniel Carrell R1726 obtained a pension for his service in the North Carolina Continental line under the 1820 act applicable to men who served in the Continental Army. Application under the 1820 act did not require proof of any service other than that rendered in the Continental Army. That veteran, however, made reference to having served in South Carolina after he was discharged from the Continental Army. His brief description of his services in the militia in South Carolina led me to the opinion expressed above.]
