

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of North Carolina Lincoln County March 25<sup>th</sup> 1783

Know all men by these presents that I Daniel Chitwood hath bargained and Sold unto John Sloan my Chance of my Negro that I was to have for my Service in South Carolina in Colonel Meddeltons [Charles Myddleton's] Ragment [regiment] of light dragoons for twenty-five pounds to me in hand payed which Chance I warrant from all other persons witness my hand and Seal

[p 4: Printed form of Indent No. 497 Book M dated October 1<sup>st</sup>, 1784 “delivered to Mr. Daniel Chitwood late Private Waters Troop Thomas’s [Colonel John Thomas Jr.s’] Regiment Sumpter’s [Thomas Sumter’s] Brigade this our Indented Certificate for the Sum of Ninety-four Pounds Sterling amount pay and bounty due him for Services in this Troop with Interest thereon from the first of April 1782 to date hereof Agreeable to Resolution of General Assembly of Ninth March last.”]

[p 5: Reverse of the above Indent: Bears an assignment of the Indent to Thomas Sumter apparently made by Peter Bocquet, Commissioner of the treasury and reciting as a party for such assignment “by Virtue of Powers in us Vested by the General Assembly of the State.” No reference is made to Chitwood on the reverse of the Indent.]
