[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]



Dated September 14th 1790 "delivered to Mr. Gustavus Colhoun our Indented Certificate for the Sum of Three hundred & thirty-five pounds ten shillings & three pence Sterling in lieu of the following Indents – Viz. [text missing] J, dated 8 December 1784, No. 185, 29th January 1785; 221 – January [text missing] 1785, & 633 April 18th 1785; P 117 April 9th 1785; S 300 – [text missing] 15th 1785, You 301, January 12th 1785, & 640 July 18th 1785; No. 271 July 27th 1785; 56/, September 9th 1785 & 651, September 13th 1785; [text missing] 631, August 29th 1785; X 3019, May 1st, 1786; Y 1141 – May 21st, 1786 & 1174 June 5th 1786, the same being for Services and Supplies.]²
