[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]



this may Certify that I have Bargained, Sold and Delivered on to John Sumter the Negro that the State of South Carolina is in Due me for my 10 month Sarvice as a light Dragoon under the command of Genl. Sumter whic I acknowledge myself fully and Cleanly Satisfied for said Negro and Bounty Witness my hand this for day of August 1784

State of North Carolina Lincoln County

This day came Israel Roberson before Me one of the Justices of said County and made oath as the law directs that the State of South Carolina is Justly indebted to him one likely Negro and all the Bounty that he was entitled to but one Cap one Shirt one pair of overalls – for his ten months Service as a light Dragoon in Colonel Hills [William Hill's] Regiment in General Sumter's Brigade and that he never Bargained or sold or made over his right of the Negro and Bounty due to him for his ten months service in the State of South Carolina. Sworn to Before me this for day of August 1784
