
[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

Know all men by these presents that I John Follinbary [sic] of the State of North Carolina and Burke County have Bargained and Sold unto George Wistenhunt [?]<sup>2</sup> of Lincoln County and State aforesaid all my Right and title of a Negro<sup>3</sup> draw Bounty and Clothing due to me for Services Done in the State of South Carolina under Captain Mckinsay [William McKenzie] in Colonel Polk's [William Polk's] Regiment [sic, Colonel William Hill's Regiment] for the Sum of Sixty pounds in hand paid and I do whatever warrant and Defend said lot or Chance from any person laying any Just Claim their unto.

In witness whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and Seal this 8<sup>th</sup> day of January 1785
