[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

Congarees April 5th 1782

Know all men by these present that I John Hays of South Carolina have Bargained and Sold in due by these presents bargain Sale and Deliver unto Benjamin Culpeper my publick Negro for a certain Bay geldon [gilding] three years old which horse is Delivered to me now in hand for the Chance of my Draw in the State Troops

as witness my hand and Seal this 5th day of April 1782

State of South Carolina Camden District} Before me William Murrell one of the Justices of the Peace for the District aforesaid Personally appeared Captain Nathaniel Martin, late of the State Brigade commanded by Brigadier General Sumter, who being duly Sworn maketh oath that whereas, John Hayes late a Soldier of his Troop in the above Mentioned Brigade having Conveyed his pay & bounty due to his brother William [text too faint to discern] deceased Joseph Crosford [?] the 30th of October 1781 he the Deponent does believe the said John Hayes [text too faint to discern] to his Said Brother William [text too faint to discern] Deceased
