[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]



March the 24th 1784 this Day personally Appeared before me Nathaniel Rogers Senior and Nathaniel Rodgers Junior and made oath as the Law directs that Nathaniel Rogers Junior to[sic] Nathaniel Rogers Senior a Soldier in Colonel William Polk's Regiment that for his service in the State Troops of South Carolina is Justly entitled to one Negro According to the Terms of Enlistment made by the General Sumpter [Thomas Sumter] and that they did not Violate nor dispose of Nor Sell the said title to the said Negro to any person Whatsoever but to James Maxwell who hath purchased the same from us this Receipt shall be good to the public of South Carolina further the said deponents Saith they never knew that he Converted to his own use public horses, saddles, Bridles, or arms or ammunition or Converter more than what he made use of in the public Service and further Saith not. Sworn before me the day and date Above written.



² Captain Thomas Shelby recruited men to join the South Carolina State troops under Brigadier General Thomas Sumter for 10 months service in the Light Dragoons. The man he recruited, however, ended up under the command of Nathaniel Marshall Martin in William Polk's Regiment under Sumter.
