

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' or 'undeciphered' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

[p 3 (retake of page 2): Printed form of indent No. 464 Book U dated July 8th, 1785 delivered to Mr. James Feast this our Indented Certificate, for the Sum of One hundred Pounds And Five Pence Sterling for forty months & sixteen days as Sergeant and three Months as private in the Continental Line in 1779 & 82 per account Audited.”]

[p 4: Reverse of the above Indent bearing, among others, the following endorsement:
I hereby Assign over to Mr. Meyer Moses and Assigns the within Indent to his or Heirs use and behoof, he having paid me the Valuable consideration for the Same – This 27th April 1786

How could Benjamin Boyd be an acting administrator for James Feast on April the 7th 1786 if James Feast were alive to sign an endorsement dated April 27th, 1786?]
