[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' or 'undeciphered' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

The Humble Petition of William Joiner
Sheweth.

That your petitioner entered as a Soldier in Captain William Alexander's Company in the State Troops commanded by General Sumpter [Thomas Sumter] and that on Application for his Indent your Petitioner found that his name was not returned, which must have happened through some neglect of his Officer, Afterwards your Petitioner Applied to General Sumpter who informed him that he as a Commissioner^{and} could not Grant him an Indent – without an Order from the house of Assembly & promised him to procure him an order, upon which your Petitioner rested satisfied, but that since General Sumpter has gone to Congress, and your Petitioner thinks that he must have forgot to procure the Order, and your Petitioner now prays that an order for his Indent may be Granted, which now lives in General Sumpter's Office –

Annual Petitioner shall ever pray &c
