[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' or 'undeciphered' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

[Note: This file contains no documents describing to the military services of Sidney Gracey. The documents reflect, however, that Sidney Gracey was placed on the South Carolina pension list at least as of June 4, 1819 at the rate of \$60 per annum as "an annuitant of the Revolutionary War" and that annual payments in that amount were due to him through March 22nd, 1825. On November 15, 1825, Elizabeth Gracey, the widow of Sidney Gracey, applied for the payment due her husband on the 1st day of March 1825 which had vested in him prior to his death intestate. She was the legal representative of the annuitant.]

The Committee of Pensions to whom was referred the Petition of Elizabeth Gracey, Praying that one years Pension Due to her late husband Sidney Gracey Deceased, to whom it appears by order, & certificate of the Treasurer herewith presented, the same is Due.

Respectfully Report, that your Committee have had the Same under Consideration, & Recommend that this House Directly Treasurer of the upper Division to pay unto Elizabeth Gracey the Sum of Sixty dollars Due to her late Husband, She being the administratrix as proven by the Certificate of James H. Witherspoon, ordinary of Lancaster District, December 1825

[p 11: Certificate dated December 20, 1825 reflecting the payment of \$60 "on account of Arrears of Pension due to Sidney Gracey at the time of her [sic] death allowed Dec'd Sep. 1825 to E. Gracey Administratrix

[Note: I believe based on the documents in this file that a soldier by the name of Sidney Gracey served in South Carolina during the Revolutionary war and was granted a pension under South Carolina law for services not described in the file documents. My guess is that someone removed the veteran's petition for a pension and failed to return it to the file.]
