[Note: Receipts, the 1st of which is dated May 28, 1819 and the last of which is dated June 2, 1826, each in the amount of \$60 made payable to “Jennet Pagan annt. [Annuitant] of the Rev. War.” She 1st appears on the list of Pensioners [B409] from the Columbia office of the South Carolina treasury in 1801. This indicates that she was the widow of a deceased soldier who fought in South Carolina during the Revolutionary War. She MAY be the widow of Capt. Alexander Pagan SC3373 since he is the only veteran whose surname was Pagan who is listed among the existing SC Audited Accounts as being deceased at the time his indent was issued to his estate in 1784.]
