
[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]


Know all men by these presents that I Robert Barnet a Soldier in aid of South Carolina for Ten Months under Command of Brigadier General Sumter [Thomas Sumter] do hereby authorize and empower Captain William Alexander to Settle for me and in my Name all the sum or sums due me from the State of South Carolina and to receive such Certificates as shall be given from the Commissioners appointed for adjusting the Same & such receipt or other Instrument of writing as may [text too faint to discern] them to pass in my Name. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 13th Day of December 1785
