[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' or 'undeciphered' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]





Union County 26 July 1791

Sir

I received your favor of the 23rd Instant, for which I am much obliged, to you for and Mrs. Brown, I am convinced won't apply for her annuities until I Come, down, which won't be in Less time than four or Five weeks – you ware kind Enough to Inform me, an order was produced, to you by a Silas Halsey for Samuel Harlan's Indent which order, I know to be false for the Harlan, that I have the order from, Did the Duty in Captain Ryan's [John Ryan's] & Thomas' Companies, and as to Harlan's Spelling his name, you know Sir/ that *he nor myself be is*² in the person who made out the pay Bill I have again sent you the order by John Miller & hope you will send the Indent by him & his Receipt shall be your Discharge for the same, & when I come Down myself, I can & will make you Sensible, the Indent belongs to the Harlan, who give me the Order, should you not Chuse [Choose] to send the Indent, I hope you will not deliver it, to know [sic, no] person till I Come Down. Geo. Hopes Indent & I [undeciphered word], was drawn by False orders; to my own knowledge & I am rather Induced to believe Mr. Coleman's W. Jackson & B. Clarks was, tho for them I Cannot assert I hope at the next meeting of the Legislatur, Step, will be Taken, with Such Damled [damn] pick pockets as Draws Indents with false orders knowing them to be such. I am Sir with great Esteem
