
I do hereby Certify that one Steer the Property of Joachim Hartstone was received by me for the use of the Italian of the Granville County Regiment of foot under my Command doing duty at Purrysburg and was Appraised at 80 Pounds, but not being passed of the Late Militia Act, am not able to make a return agreeable to the tenor thereof.

This 4<sup>th</sup> day of June 1778

S/ John L. Bourquin Majr.
