[Note: Except as transcribed below, the images of the documents in this file posted on are largely illegible. From what portions of the documents as can be discerned, it appears that the veteran applied for reimbursement for services as shown on the return made by Colonel Robert Anderson and for supplies and property lost in the service. According to Bobby Gilmer Moss's Roster of South Carolina veterans, the veteran was issued an indent No. 501 Book W. The amount of that indent cannot be discerned from the documents in the file. Also, it appears that the veteran is referred to alternately as Philemon Harvey and Philip Harvey.]




