

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' or 'undeciphered' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

[p 2: Printed form of Indent No. 336 Book C dated April 27, 1784 "delivered to Captain John Hennington [sic] of the 3rd South Carolina Continental Regiment this our INDENTED CERTIFICATE for the Sum of Three hundred & Fifty-four pounds five Shillings & four pence Sterling the Amount of his pay and Subsistence to the 11th February 1780 & for his Additional State pay to same time as per Certificate from the Auditor General dated the 27th day of April 1784."]

[p 3: Reverse of the above Indent bearing, among others, an endorsement by the veteran acknowledging receipt of one year's interest due on the Indent received August 24, 1784 with his signature their own appearing as follows:


