[p 2: Printed form of Indent No. 59 Book M dated first of October 1784 "delivered to Mr. Isaac Herrold late Private in Lieut. Col. Sam. Hammonds [Samuel Hammond's] Regiment of State Troops this our INDENTED CERTIFICATE for the Sum of Ninety four pounds Sterling being the Ballance of Pay and Bounty due him for Services in that Regiment Together with Interest thereon from the first April 1782 to date hereof Agreeable to Resolution of General Assembly of the Eleventh March last &c."]

[p 3: Reverse of the above Indent bearing, among others, the following endorsement:

August ye 15 = 1785

I asine [assign] over my right of the Within Indent to Lettey Gorden and Edmon Bearden & Henry Clark for Valu [value] resece'd [received] of them as Wetnes [witness] my hand
