

[p 6: Printed form of indent No. 1247 Book Y dated June 5th, 1786 “delivered to Mr. John Lawson this our INDENTED CERTIFICATE, for the Sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds fifteen Shillings Ster^e [Sterling] [for] Services as a Pilot to Count d’Estaing’s fleet also pay during the time he was a Prisoner to the time he was released from his Parole – as per account passed by the Commissioners.”]
