[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' or 'undeciphered' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

[Note: The coversheet for this claim is missing. It relates to Indent No. 1288 Book X and is dated December 29, 1785. Unfortunately, this coversheet is among the Indents missing from the South Carolina Audited Accounts between stub numbers 1265 through 1332, all of which have been lost. Fortunately, the file contains quite a bit of the information relating to this veteran's claim as transcribed below.]



I Thomas Lindsey do hereby acknowledge to assign over all my Right, Title and Interest to Mr. Samuel Adams of and to an Indent Issued by the Treasurers in my behalf for the Sum of One hundred & Eighty one pounds five shillings Sterling No. 1289 – book X – together with the Interest that is or may be hereafter due on the said Indent and the above Principal & Interest to appropriate to his own use in whatever manner he may think fit having received full Satisfaction for the same as Witness my hand this 1st day of January 1785 S/ Thomas Lindsey
