


[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

[p 2: Form of Indent No. 580 Book Z dated 29<sup>th</sup> September 1788 delivered to "Mr. George Blissett [sic] this our Indented Certificate for the Sum of Six pounds Seventeen Shillings & a penny Sterling for Militia duty per account passed by the Commissioners."]

[p 3: reverse of the above Indent which bears a partially legible endorsement by the veteran acknowledging receipt of interest on the Indent. His signature is legible as follows:

The only other endorsement is by Mountague Simons dated Jan. 29, 1789. It isn't clear how Simons obtained rights in the Indent.

A handwritten signature in cursive script that reads "Mountague Simons". The signature is written in a similar style to the one above, with a closing bracket "]" at the end.
