[Note: I have included this record in this pension database because it likely indicates that someone named Daniel Branon [Brandon, Brannon, Brannan??] served in one of the companies enlisted in the SC State Troops in 1781 to serve under Brigadier General Thomas Sumter at a time when wages were paid in the form of Negro slaves taken from Tories. This horrific form of payment was known at the time as “Sumter’s Wages.”]
