The reason I have included this claim in our database is because the following receipt gives critical information as to the location of troops under the command of Lieutenant Colonel Edward Barnwell as of March 19, 1782.]

State of South Carolina 19<sup>th</sup> of March 1782

Received from Mr. John L Birch [sic, John L. Buche] two four years old Steers computed to Weigh seven hundred twenty pounds <sup>wt</sup> for the use of Brigadier General Barnwell's [John Barnwell's]<sup>2</sup> Militia now in Camp in Hays Burg [?]<sup>3</sup> under the command of Lieutenant Colonel Edward Barnwell [Edward Barnwell]

State of S. Carolina 19<sup>th</sup> of March 1782  
Received from Mr. John L. Birch two four years Old Steers Computed  
to Weigh Seven Hundred and Twenty pounds wt. for the Use of Brigadier  
General Barnwell's Militia now in Camp in Hays Burg. Under the  
Command of Lieut Col. Edward Barnwell.  
By order of Lieut Col. Barnwell's press Warrant to me James M. McGowin

[Note: The Claimant also was reimbursed for the hire of 1 Negro for 122 days at 1 Shilling 6 pence per day. Unfortunately this Negro's services will go unacknowledged because his or her name is not stated in these records nor the nature of the services rendered.]
