

Southern Campaigns American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Pension Application of Moses Clack W2921                      Ann Clack      VA  
Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris. Revised 15 Dec 2018.

For the purpose of obtaining the benefit of "An act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the army of the Revolution" approved on the 15<sup>th</sup> of May 1828 I Moses Clack of the County of Fleming in the state of Kentucky do hereby declare that I enlisted in the continental line of the army of the revolution for and during the war, and continued in its service until its termination, at which period I was a private in Captain William Barrett's [William Barret VAS1197] company in the third regiment of dragoons of the continental line. And I also declare that I was afterward entitled to a certificate for the reward of eighty dollars to which I was entitled under a resolve of Congress passed the 15<sup>th</sup> of May 1888

I the deponent had taken a furlough in South carolina subject to further call until the definitive treaty was signed, therefore I did not procure the requisite certificate under the act of Congress above referred to, the furlough referred to was delivered to the auditor of Virginia after the treaty was signed.

And I further declare that I was not, on the 15<sup>th</sup> of March 1828 on the Pension List of the United States



Richmond the 13<sup>th</sup> October 1783

I do certify that Moses Clack served three years in the 10<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment except a few day when he reenlisted into the Cavalry and believe he has been in actual service ever since with the southern army – and tells me he was born and raised in the state of Virginia

NOTE: On 5 July 1843 Ann Clack, 67, applied for a pension stating that she married Moses Clack in Albemarle County VA on 19 Oct 1792, and he died on 25 Sep 1842. Her statement was certified by Dixon Clack and Dixson Dedman. In the file is a copy of a bond signed on 16 Oct 1792 by Moses Clack and Samuel Deadman for the marriage of Clack to Ann Deadman. On 12 Sep 1848 Ann Clack was said to be 81 years old.
