

the heirs of John Holcomb for his Revolutionary War services, were presented to the House of Representatives during the 2nd Session, 23rd Congress, 1st Session, 24th Congress, 2nd Session, 24th Congress, and 2nd Session, 25th Congress, each by petition and the pages of those journals are recorded, respectively, as 106, 672, 270 and 112. The report was adverse and laid on the table. As a possible source of information desired, I would suggest examination of the designated pages of those journals in the Congressional Library.
