His name appears on a list of applicants for invalid pension returned by the District Court for the District of Kentucky, North Carolina, and South Carolina, submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on April 25, 1794, and printed in the American State Papers, class 9, page 105.

Rank: Private

3d battalion of North Carolina.

Disability: Wounded in the articulation of the knee, while in actual line of his duty, at the action of the Eutaw Springs, State of South Carolina.

When and where disabled: Sept. 8, 1781, Eutaw Springs.

Residence: County of Duplin [North Carolina]

Remarks: enlisted in May, 1781; discharged January 31, 1782.

Evidence transmitted by the District Court perfect.
