Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

His name appears on a list of Applicants for invalid pension returned by the District Court for the District of Kentucky submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on March 2, 1795, and printed in the American State Papers class 9, page 171 –

Rank; Lieutenant

Regiment; Colonel Cocke's Virginia militia

Disability; Wounded in his left side by a ball, which destroyed 2 or 3 of his small ribs.

When and where disabled; March 15, 1781, Guilford:

Residence, Mercer County, Kentucky

Remarks; Militia

Evidence complete, excepting that the examining physicians in their report, do not state the degree of his disability
