Pension Application of James Sewell (Sewall) Sur. Ctf. 7777

[In response to queries regarding a James Sewell the Pension Office on 22 Aug 1922 sent the following reply:]

In response to your letter of May 30 [sic], 1922, you are advised that from the records of this Bureau, it appears that James Sewell, or Sewall, while living in Clay County, Missouri, aged seventy-six years, was pensioned on Certificate Number 7777, which issued Apr, 2, 1833, at the rate of \$26.66 per annum from March 4, 1831, under the Act of June 7, 1832, on account of his service as a private in the Virginia Militia, during the War of the Revolution.

There is no data on file as to his family and no further data on file as to his service.

[James "Sewell" was, in fact, James Senewel, whose records are in pension application S17080.]
