Pension Application of William Crouch X889



[“X889” is a file number assigned by HeritageQuest. On the original file jacket “R—“ appears in place of a file number, suggesting that the claim was rejected. Notes in the file of William Crouch W27913 indicate that this application was originally misfiled with that William Crouch.]

William Crouch’s Declaration

For the purpose of obtaining the benefits of the act, entitled “an act for the relief of certain Surviving Officers and Solders of the army of the Revolution,” approved the 15th of May 1828, I William Crouch of Goochland in the County of Goochland in the State of Virginia do hereby declare that I enlisted in the year 1780 or early in the year 1781 in the Revolutionary service of my country against Great Britain for and served to the end of the War and was commanded at the close thereof by Captain Thomas Parker[?] of, I believe the 2nd Va. Reg’t on Cont’l establishment, and rec’d. my discharge from him perhaps about the last of the year 1782 or the beginning of the year 1783. which discharge is either lost or mislaid
Witness my hand the 9th day of April 1829.

Va. Richmond 13 April 1829

Sir [Secretary of the Treasury] Enclosed is Wm. Crouch’s declaration asking payment of his claim against the U.S. as a soldier in the Revolution under the Act of Congress of 15 of May 1828 which claim I hope will receive immediate attention, the man is a poor man and wants the amount due him badly.

It appears by a List of certificates in this office which issued to officers and soldiers of the Virginia line on Continental establishment of the Revolutionary army that a Certificate issued on the 28 Nov 1783 to William Crouch a soldier of infantry for £34.5.9 – being the balance of his full pay or depreciation on the settlement of his accounts, which said certificate was delivered to Tho. Lumpkin.
