[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

LeRoy Newby Sergeant belonging to the state Ridgmet [Regiment] having served three years as a good Soldier it being his full time of Inlistment he is hereby Discharge from the said Regiment & Intitled to the Benefit of the Act of Assembly by which the State Regiment was raised. Given under my hand @ the point of fork in the County of Fluvanna this 1 Day of June 1781



I do Certifie that Leroy Newby inlisted as a Serjant in the State Garrison 1778 for the time of Three years which time he served as a good & faithful Soldier & was legally Discharged at the Point of fork in Fluvanna County.
